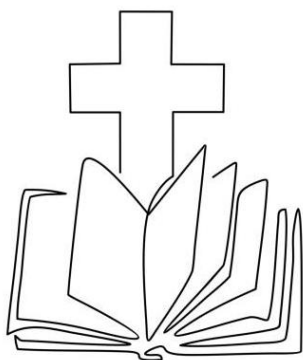

SCHOOL UNIFORM

A gentle reminder to please ensure that all items of your child's clothing, including jumpers, cardigans, PE jackets etc are clearly labelled with their full name.

Please note that school cannot take responsibility for lost items of uniform. Each child has their own designated peg to store belongings, helping to promote independence and responsibility. ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY CONCERNS

As we end Autumn 1, I must share my concerns about our current attendance and punctuality levels.

School attendance for Autumn 1 stands at 95%, below to the national expectation of 97%. Some classes are 92%, which is considered borderline persistent absence.

My concern is that our attendance is already below national expectation before we even enter the winter period, which naturally brings illness. Poor attendance means our children are missing out on valuable learning and school experiences.

I am also seeing a high number of late arrivals, averaging 50-60 late marks per week. As you can appreciate, late arrival to class disrupts learning and impacts massively on children when they arrive at school and lessons have already begun.

I am encouraging all families to make a conscious effort to improve both attendance and punctuality next term so that every child can access the full curriculum and school experiences that they are entitled to.

END OF HALF-TERM

We've reached the end of our first half-term and what a busy, jam-packed few weeks it has been! Thank you to all the children, staff and parents for your hard work and continued support.

I hope that everyone enjoys a well-deserved break, spending time with family, relaxing and recharging for another exciting term ahead.

Children return to school on **Monday 3rd November 2025.**



ROAD SAFETY

When the clocks go back on Sunday 26th October, it will start to get dark much earlier. This makes it more important than ever to make sure that you can be seen when you are out and about and near roads.

How many ways can you think to make yourself bright and seen?

Here are some road safety tips to keep you safe:

Brightly coloured or fluorescent clothing shows up well in daylight and at dusk when you're heading to and from school.

If you're out and about when it's dark, wear reflective items to make sure you can be seen in car headlights.

Don't forget to accessorize! Even small items such as stickers on your school bag are a great way to improve your visibility.

Of course, "being bright" helps drivers to see you but that won't guarantee that keeps you safe. You still need to stop and look in all directions for traffic every time you cross roads.
