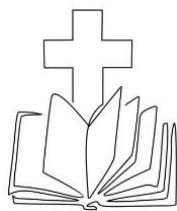

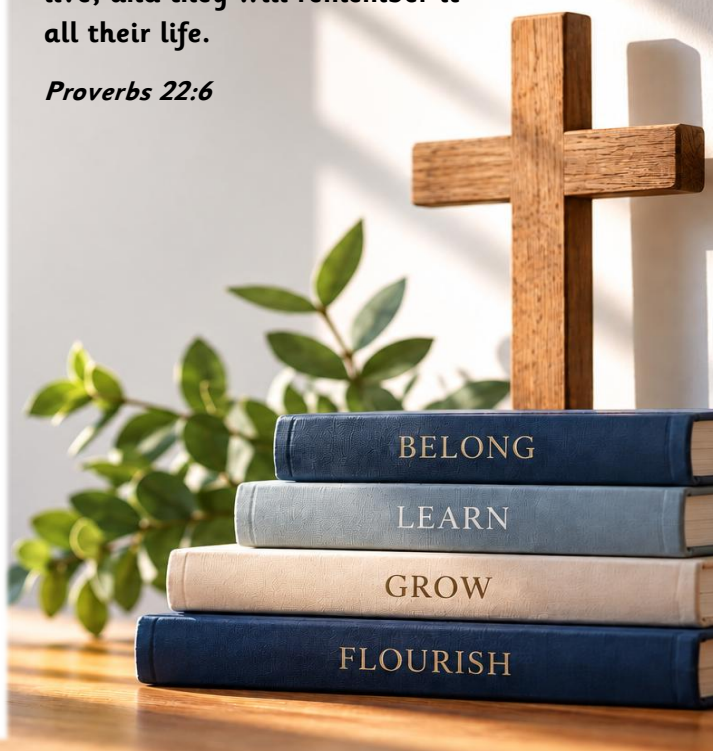

We know that regular attendance has a direct impact on children's progress, confidence and wellbeing and we are committed to working together to improve this.

To support this, rather than waiting until the end of term to highlight achievement, we recognise 100% attendance of the week!

Any child who achieves 100% attendance for the week will be invited to choose a reward from the class attendance prize box. We fully understand that children will sometimes be unwell and must remain at home when necessary. By recognising 100% attendance each week, we hope to provide more achievable milestones for our pupils.

ATTENDANCE & WELFARE PROCEDURES**REPORTING ABSENCE**

If your child is unwell or unable to attend school (including nursery & daycare), please remember that parents and carers must telephone school office (0151 260 9697) or daycare office (0151 264 8945) before **9.15am**.

Messages sent via Famly | ClassDoJo cannot be accepted as notification of absence.

If you leave a voicemail, a member of staff will return your call as part of our safeguarding first-response procedures. This ensures that we have spoken directly with a parent or carer & can confirm the reason for the absence.

If we have not received notification by 9.15am, staff will begin our safeguarding first-response process, which may include follow-up phone calls and, where necessary, a home visit.

SAFE HANDOVER & COLLECTION

Safeguarding our children is always our priority.

At the end of each session or school day, staff must ensure that every child is handed over safely to an **authorised adult**.

We kindly ask all families to support us by following our handover arrangements:

- Children will only be released to a parent/carer or **authorised person aged 16 or over**.
- If someone different is collecting your child, you must contact the School | Daycare Office in advance. Please do not send changes to collection arrangements via ClassDoJo | FAMLY, as staff are with the children and may not see messages during the day.
- When notifying us of a different person collecting, you will be asked to provide a collection **password**. This must be shared with the person collecting and will always be requested by staff before your child is released.
- If the correct password cannot be provided, or staff have any concerns about the person collecting, your child will not be released until appropriate checks have been completed.
- Please give staff the time and space to complete each handover safely. Staff must focus on one safe handover at a time and ensure every child is accounted for.
- Home-time is a particularly busy safeguarding point in the day. If you need a longer conversation with a member of staff, please arrange a suitable time rather than discussing the matter during handover.

If staff have any safeguarding concerns about an adult collecting a child, including concerns that they may be under the influence of alcohol or drugs or otherwise unable to care for the child safely, we will follow our safeguarding procedures and will not knowingly release a child into an unsafe situation.

ARRIVAL

Our Nursery and Daycare team will be ready to warmly welcome your child at the start of their allocated session. We know that family life can be busy, but we kindly ask that children **arrive on time** so they can settle alongside their friends and enjoy the full Early Years experience from the beginning of their session.

Although attendance at Nursery and Daycare is not statutory, we want our youngest children to attend every day and make the most of their Early Years experience.

Regular attendance helps children develop important routines, build relationships and benefit fully from their funded entitlement and the learning, play and experiences planned for them.

Arriving part-way through the morning or afternoon can mean that children miss valuable experiences and can also interrupt learning and activities already underway.

HOME-TIME COLLECTION

If your child is not accessing wraparound provision, we kindly ask that parents adhere to timings above and arrive promptly for home-time collection, at the end of their allocated session, to prevent unnecessary upset for children.

EXTENDED SCHOOL: WRAP AROUND

BREAKFAST CLUB

Just a gentle reminder that our Breakfast Club opens at **8.00am**. The last admission to Breakfast Club is **8.15am**. This allows children plenty of time to enjoy their breakfast without feeling rushed, before getting ready for the start of their school or Early Years session.

AFTER-SCHOOL CLUB

Just a gentle reminder that our After-School Club closes at **5.00pm**. Our After-School Club provides wraparound childcare for families who need care beyond the end of the school | nursery day. It is run by our own staff, helping us to keep the provision familiar for our children and as affordable as possible for families. All After-School Club sessions must be **booked in advance**. Advance booking is essential so that we can plan appropriate staffing, maintain required staff-to-child ratios and ensure that children are safely accounted for.

LATE COLLECTION POLICY

ATTENDANCE, ARRIVAL & COLLECTION

MORNING ARRIVAL

School gates will open at **8.35am**, with members of our Senior Leadership Team on the playground to welcome and supervise children. Main school doors will open at 8.40am, giving children time to enter, settle into class and get ready for the day ahead.

The school day begins promptly at **8.45am** and the gates will close at this time. Regular attendance and punctuality are really important. Arriving on time helps children to have a calm and settled start to their day and ensures that they do not miss valuable learning.

Any child arriving after 8.45am must be brought by their parent/carer to the School Office and signed in using our online register. Children must not be dropped off or left at the School Office gate. For safeguarding purposes, a parent/carer must accompany their child into the School Office and ensure they are safely handed over to a member of staff.

HOME-TIME COLLECTION

School gates will open at **3.10pm** for parents and carers. The school day ends at:

Reception – Year 2: 3.15pm | Year 3 – Year 6: 3.20pm

The school gates will close at **3.25pm**. After this time, parents/carers must use the School Office entrance to collect their child.

Please arrive promptly for collection. Children can understandably become worried or upset when they are expecting to be collected and their parent or carer has not arrived.

We understand that there may occasionally be unavoidable circumstances which result in a late arrival or collection. However, regular or persistent lateness, either when arriving at school or being collected at the end of the day, is an attendance and safeguarding concern. This will be monitored by school and, where necessary, followed up with parents/carers in line with our attendance and safeguarding procedures.

KEEPING OUR ENTRANCES SAFE

To help us maintain a safe and clear route into and out of school, please avoid gathering directly outside the main gate or along the railings. Keeping this area clear allows children and families to enter and leave the school site safely.
